MAUNDY THURSDAY PRAYER VIGIL The sign-up sheet for the Maundy Thursday Prayer Vigil is on the bulletin board in Surface Hall. Please help us mark this most holy night by signing up for an hour to keep watch.

THE BISHOP IS COMING The Rt. Rev. Terry White will make his annual visitation to Christ Church on Sunday, April 28th. He will preach and celebrate confirmation, reception, and reaffirmation at both services. If you would like to be received, confirmed, or reaffirm your baptismal covenant, please speak with Mother Becca, Deacon Kellie, or Father Steve.

NURSERY is provided for children up to 5 years of age during Sunday worship services and special church events. All caregivers are screened and complete child abuse prevention training prior to employment. The Nursery can be found in the front hallway off Surface Hall. Please ask a Host or Usher if you need assistance.

CHILDREN'S CHURCH occurs during the 10:00 AM worship service and is for children age 3 years old through 3^{rd} grade. The children follow the cross out during the singing of the *Gloria* and return during the welcome and announcements.

THE CHILDREN'S WORSHIP PACKETS contain activity sheets and crayons/colored pencils for children to use during worship. They are located beside the stairs to the sacristy in Surface Hall just outside the nave. Please return them after the service.

THE CHILDREN'S QUIET BOOKS are handmade, felt and laminated books for use by children during worship services and can be found on a rack in Surface Hall. Parents and kids are encouraged to use these books during services. We ask that they be used gently and returned at the end of each service.

ASSISTED LISTENING DEVICES are available and located at the back of the church in a basket on a table near the front door. These devices are free for use by parishioners, or guests, who range from being slightly to profoundly hard of hearing. The receivers pick up the wireless FM broadcast of all the lay and clergy speakers using microphones and reduce room echoes and other distracting sounds. Those not using hearing aids can listen to the receiver with the attached ear buds. Listeners who have hearing aids with a telecoil (telephone coil T-switch) setting option can use the receiver with a neck loop telecoil coupler. The loudness of sound can be adjusted with the volume control wheel located at the top of the receiver. Please stop by the bulletin board in Surface Hall and check-out the information under the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Ministry sign. Outreach Spotlight

HOTEL INC (Helping Others Through Extending Love In the Name of Christ) was created 38 years ago to serve impoverished and homeless families of Warren County. In the effort to end homelessness rather than maintain it, HOTEL INC seeks to provide Warren County citizens with pathways to stable housing, community resources, and quality food by building relationships and serving our neighbors. HOTEL INC offers services in three main program areas.

- Homeless & Housing Services Includes case management to help individuals navigate a path to stable housing, the Preferred Tenant Program that offers education in tenant issues and budgeting in a small group setting, and a drop-in center for people experiencing street homelessness to have access to shower, laundry, mail, computers, chaplains, and an on-site store.
- Street Medicine Teams of volunteer nurses, public health experts, mental health professionals, doctors, housing navigators, and the street medicine coordinator provide health care to people who are street homeless or precariously-housed. Services include access to AHCA, navigation of the health care system, basic care to help with survival, vital checks, wound care, health assessments, and a Transitional Medical Respite House that gives people shelter and a safe place to recover from medical treatment or illness.
- **Food Insecurity** The Manna Mart food pantry provides nutritionally-balanced monthly meals with options for participants to choose. Local fresh foods, including produce, eggs, chicken, and beef, are provided by an on-site garden and by local farmers and gardeners.

HOTEL INC's funding is derived from private donations, foundation grants, and fundraising. In addition to a dedicated staff serving in each of these programs, there are numerous volunteers who give of their time and talents each week to assure that everyone who comes to HOTEL INC for assistance is treated with kindness, compassion, and dignity.
