Worship

NURSERY is provided for children up to 5 years of age during Sunday worship services and special church events. All caregivers are screened and complete child abuse prevention training prior to employment. The Nursery can be found in the front hallway off Surface Hall. Please ask a Host or Usher if you need assistance.

CHILDREN'S CHURCH occurs during the 10:00 AM worship service and is for children age 3 years old through 3rd grade. The children follow the cross out during the singing of the *Gloria* and return during the welcome and announcements.

THE CHILDREN'S WORSHIP PACKETS contain activity sheets and crayons/colored pencils for children to use during worship. They are located beside the stairs to the sacristy in Surface Hall just outside the nave. Please return them after the service.

THE CHILDREN'S QUIET BOOKS are handmade, felt and laminated books for use by children during worship services and can be found on a rack in Surface Hall. Parents and kids are encouraged to use these books during services. We ask that they be used gently and returned at the end of each service.

ASSISTED LISTENING DEVICES are available and located at the back of the church in a basket on a table near the front door. If you have slight to moderate hearing loss, you may benefit from the use of an assisted listening device. The devices serve as receivers for the church's speaker system transmitter. Simply place the earbud (earbuds) in your ear (ears), turn the volume control wheel to activate the device, and adjust the sound volume for maximum comfort and listening clarity. All devices are maintained and cleaned regularly. Questions pertaining to these devices and CEC's Deaf and Hard of Hearing Ministry can be directed to Terry and/or Miliska Knauff.

Outreach Spotlight

Living Waters for the World (LWW)

LWW empowers everyday people to change lives through clean water. November 2-11 our mission team will embark on a trip to install a water purification system in a medical clinic that services three communities on the Amazon River in Peru who currently exist without any access to clean water. The system will capture rainwater from the roof and using solar power, pass the water through a series of filters and UV light that will purify the water. The team will also educate the people using spiritual modules as well as basic health and hygiene lessons. Team members are: Jan Funk, Laura Goodwin, Laurie Joyce, Belinda and Digby Palmer, John Parker, and Gary Reimer.

NEWS FROM NEW BERN - Cortney Dale, Associate Rector at Christ Church New Bern, North Carolina, evacuated to Boone, North Carolina with her family before Hurricane Florence knocked the Carolinas sideways. While in Boone, she visited Cindy Raugh Banks, former Associate Rector at Christ Church Bowling Green. Cortney and her family attended church this past Sunday with Cindy Banks.

Monday of this week Cortney and her family returned to New Bern. Their house escaped the ferocity of the storm. Christ Church New Bern received no structural nor flood damage, but many heavy limbs were knocked from trees into their church yard. Many hands were needed to clear the church's property. Other residents of New Bern were not so fortunate. Three feet of water entered their children's minister's house.

Tuesday of this week Cortney was engaged in the same business as her great-grandfather, delivering ice to those in need. Christ Church New Bern has been asked to be a conduit to funnel those in need of employment to a contractor to help clear storm damage in her area.
