# FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

I think it was one of my pastoral care professors who said that a priest cannot properly care for his/her congregation in their times of need if he/she can't also celebrate with them in times of joy. I have found this to be true in my ministry. It is because of a history of celebrations: births, baptisms, marriages, graduations, birthdays, anniversaries, soccer games, and dance recitals, that makes those moments of hardship: illness, injury, funerals, and other hard goodbyes more poignant. I've thought a lot about the balance between joy and sorrow over the past month as we have seen an uptick in those needing pastoral care during times of illness, injury, and grief.



As the calendar turns to a new year, it brings with it many opportunities to celebrate. With the darkest day of the year behind us, we will slowly begin to notice the increasing light, even as we celebrate the light of Christ that has come into the world. After we (at least Will Derryberry and I) rejoice in an Alabama victory over Clemson on January 1, we will turn our attention to the Feast of the Epiphany. One of the seven Principal Feasts of the Church, Epiphany is the day on which we remember the coming of the Magi, who, by the light of a star, travelled great distances to offer gifts and worship to the King of kings. It is my hope that we will begin a new tradition that evening, gathering to worship with Evening Prayer and to ask God's blessing upon chalk that we can take home to mark our houses with God's blessing for the coming year.

Monday, January 8, marks the first anniversary of our ministry together. This year has both flown by and seemed to go on forever. It will be good to have finished a full church year together, to learn our quirks, and iron out the wrinkles. As we look ahead to another year, I give thanks for all that we have accomplished together over. I hope to celebrate that day with another Alabama National Championship. On January 24, I will celebrate the 10th anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood, and it seems that most of our staff have birthdays in January. It will be a month of much rejoicing.



Of course, the premier event on our calendar of celebrations will come on January 18, as Bishops Scott Mayer of Northwest Texas and Terry White of Kentucky will join clergy from around the church in laying hands on Becca and inviting the Holy Spirit to fill her with grace and power and to make her a priest in Christ's one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. This will be a joyous occasion in Becca's life, of course, but also in our common life as the people of Christ Church, members of the Diocese of Kentucky, and, really, for the entire Episcopal Church.

I hope you will mark your calendars for this season of celebration, as together we give thanks to God for all the many blessings of this life.

Merry Christmas, Happy New Year, Joyous Epiphany, Grace, Peace, and Roll Tide!

## FROM THE ASSOCIATE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

It was about six years ago that I first began actively discerning a call to ministry. I took a private retreat to St. Mary's Sewanee to spend dedicated time in prayer and honest reflection. My journey has been circuitous at best, but all along the way the call has been compelling and continual. This month, I stand on the cusp of the final step in my formal discernment to the priesthood, as I will be ordained as a priest here at Christ Church on January 18, at 6:00pm. This is very exciting and I hope all will join us for that ordination service.



In the Episcopal Church, those who are seeking to take holy orders of the priesthood have to serve for at least six months as a transitional deacon, which is why I have begun my time with you all serving as a deacon. Because our holy orders are hierarchical in nature, one must serve as a deacon before being ordained a priest, and as a priest before being ordained a bishop. This perhaps presents the most challenges in regards to the difference between perpetual deacons and transitional deacons; the difference between Kellie's orders and mine. While I am serving in a transitional period as a deacon, Kellie has been called, supported, and ordained as a deacon in God's church.

One of the advantages of having both a transitional deacon and a perpetual deacon is that it opens up the conversation around vocation and calling. While Kellie, Steve, and I all wear collars, we are called to different functions within the church. The same is true for those not ordained. I'm pretty convinced that God places many calls upon our lives, and if we listen in prayer and through those whom God sends to us, we are able to find our path. One can be called to be an accountant, a stay-at-home parent, a lawyer, a teacher, or any number of other vocations.

Perhaps my favorite quote, which I used in my first sermon at Christ Church, is a note from Annie Dillard that speaks to our vocations, "How we spend our days is, of course, how we spend our lives." I love this quote because it shines light upon a truth which we rarely take time to note: that our intentions, hopes, dreams, and faith matter very little if we do not spend our everyday lives pursuing them. This is true in every vocation. One of my favorite collects in the prayer book is the collect for vocation in daily work.

*Almighty God our heavenly Father, you declare your glory and show forth your handiwork in the heavens and in the earth: Deliver us in our various occupations from the service of self alone, that we may do the work you give us to do in truth and beauty and for the common good; for the sake of him who came among us as one who serves, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen. (BCP, p.261)*

As we begin this new year, may each of us live out our days with a faith that saturates everything we do and every choice we make. May our hearts be so guided by the love of Christ that we see the image of God in every person we meet.
