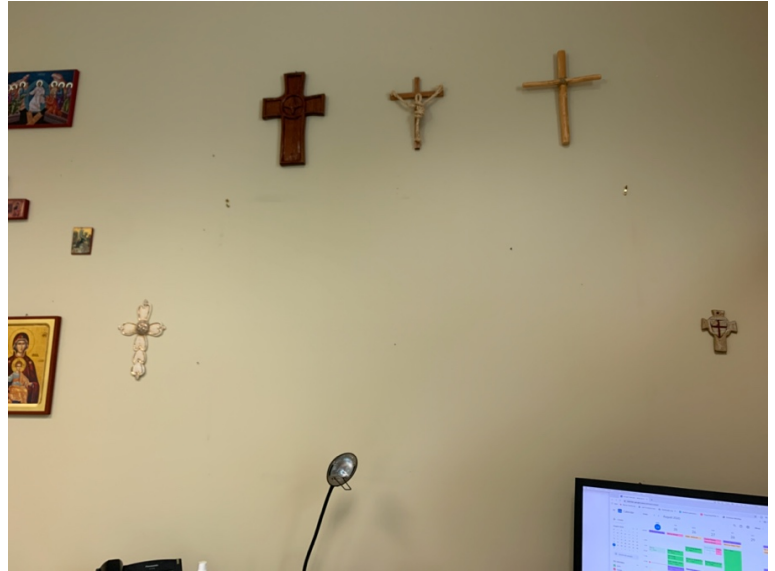

From The Rector

Dear Friends,

I've heard it said that the worst investment you could have made this year was in a day planner. 2020 has certainly been one in which throwing out the playbook is daily occurrence. Through the course of this pandemic, there have been days when planning even a week ahead seemed foolish. I'll admit that there were a few times, when I wasn't even sure I felt comfortable planning for the next afternoon.



By now, you've probably read the latest update from our Restart Task Force. Continuing the cancellation of in-person worship indefinitely isn't an easy pill to swallow, but looking back over the past few weeks since we first named this reality in our small group, I have found it freeing. Our motto over the summer has been, "Let's give it another month." We've given it another month and another month and another month to the point that the program year nearly arrived without me even noticing. When you're living a month at a time, there isn't much room or motivation to dream. There's no need to imagine a different future when "normal" is constantly on the horizon.

From The Associate Rector

Early on in the pandemic, I knew that I needed some sort of rhythm of life that would help me mark the days, but also help me to pull my anxious mind out of the constant flurry of news about the virus. While I had often taken my dogs to walk on the greenway near our house, back in March when everything shut down, it became a lifeline. It was the one place I went outside of getting groceries and coming to the church building on Sunday mornings. I rarely saw other folks, but the few that I did, I began to recognize as we passed each other from a distance with a small good morning wave.

These walks on the greenway by the creek became a lifeline for more than just an excuse to get out of the house, they were an opportunity to connect to the rhythm of nature. This past week, as I was walking with my dog, noticing the intensity of the summer green of the forest, I felt the first hint of a cool breeze that always indicates that though it's still hot and summer, fall is coming. Further down the trail, as I noticed just how vibrantly full the foliage all around us was, I looked down and saw the first yellow leaves that decided that they were ready to signal that a change is coming.

When I started walking this trail, there was frost on the ground and some mornings the temperature hovered around freezing. The trees were bare and the cool blue of an early spring sky seemed vast and incomprehensible. And as I walked, I realized that we stand here, yet again, at the turn of another season in this phase of our common life, and it two things struck me powerfully.

First, like most folks, the older I get, the faster the years seem to flow by; month after month, season after season, I look around and say, "I can't believe it's already ____!" And it was there on that trail, thinking back to the way the earth looked when the pandemic took a hold of it that I realized that this time has both flown by and has felt impossibly slow. I both can't believe that we've been doing this for almost six months AND can't believe it's only been six months. Time keeps moving along, but it feels a bit like moving through quicksand.

The second thing I realized is that this greenway and creek bed give a testament to the way in which, though time may feel like it's moving through quicksand, growth continues to happen. It seems that so much in our world has been on pause; events have been delayed or canceled, most of us are just now navigating new experiences as the country attempts to reopen and schools come back in session in a variety of formats. Though it may feel like much of our common life has been on pause, nature has continued to grow and to flourish.

The creek bed at Jennings Creek isn't just the place where I have gone throughout the pandemic to move my body, or to re-center my mind, or to still my anxious mind, it's also been the place where the tangible reality of growth, slow unremarkable growth, has been on display. The soaring trees that remained bare while the undergrowth of the forest filled in with green new growth first. The imperceptible number of various shades of green and blue, and they way that weave in and out of each other remind me that growth and change rarely yield a single result. And the fullness of the forest reminds me that even though it may have once been bare and frosty, the rhythm of nature was at work, always cultivate a fullness that would have been hard to imagine in March.

The creek bed at Jennings Creek has taught me these things, and it also helps me remember that soon, those vibrant trees will be bare again, but that their growth is not dependent upon what I can perceive with my limited vision. These lessons from nature are so vital for us to remember as we navigate into a new season, but continued life of the pandemic. We may not feel that we are growing or changing, but God is always at work within us, even when we can't see it with our limited vision.

Living into God's Dream

Last month, during four weeks of story-telling, learning and, yes, some discomfort, Shelley Carter and Leslie Weigel led a group of CEC parishioners (plus some special friends) in a study of Ta-Nehisi Coates' book *Between the World and Me*. One unexpected element of our study time together was the sharing of written and video resources that are available for further learning and spiritual guidance for building a future without Racism.

Coates repeatedly referenced "the Dream" in *Between the World...* describing an American dream of work and housing opportunity and of physical security that was largely unavailable to the dark-skinned children of his generation. Since the conclusion of our class, as we start to study other texts, we begin to see references to another dream, God's dream for all of us, personally and communally. We realize that while Coates had provided a wake-up call, we need to look further and to look deeper into our faith, the teachings of Jesus, our Baptismal Covenant, to seek ways of addressing and changing the biased ways we treat our fellow human beings.

This self-examination has led Leslie and Shelley back to a book we had shared together in our Education for Ministry (EfM) class a couple of years ago. When we dusted it off and looked back to our underlinings, we realized that it could speak to us in a new and deeper way today. The book is entitled *Living into God's Dream: Dismantling Racism in America*. It consists of a series of essays, written by contemporary theological voices and edited by Catherine Meeks, a leader in the Episcopal Church in Atlanta where she has been a strong voice in the pursuit of Becoming Beloved Community in America.

We are excited to begin reading *Living into God's Dream* and to launch a new study group beginning on Sunday September 13, at 9 AM, to examine the messages from these brief and accessible essays. Books are available for purchase online in paperback or Kindle versions, and a supply is available at the church office.

In addition, we are working with Laura and Karen to create a study group site online where interested parishioner can learn from each other and share resources that they discover in support of the Beloved Community that God is asking us to become.



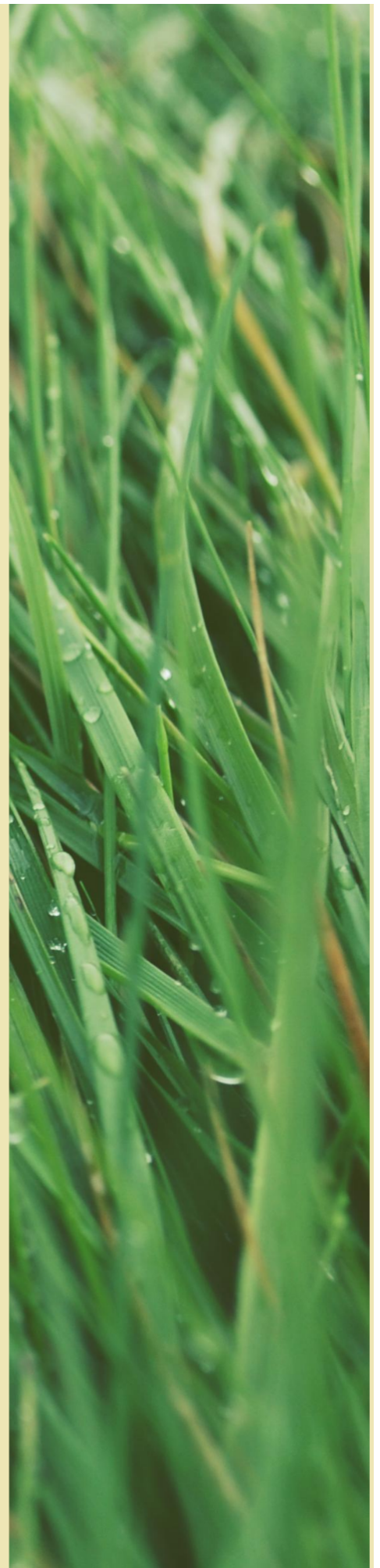

Living Water for the World News

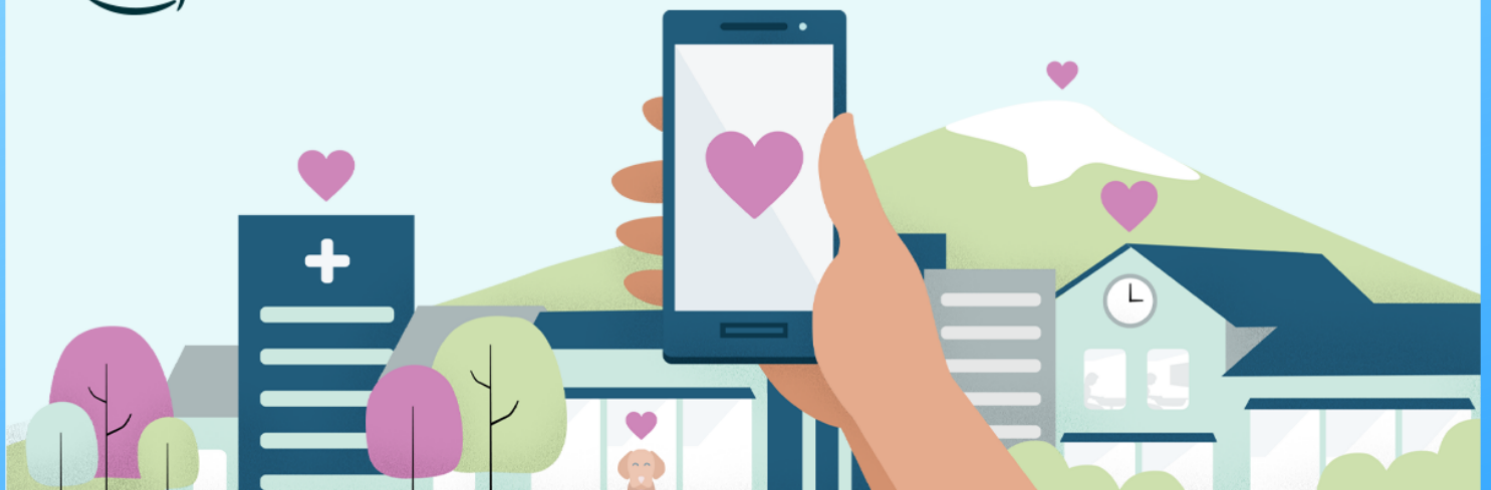
