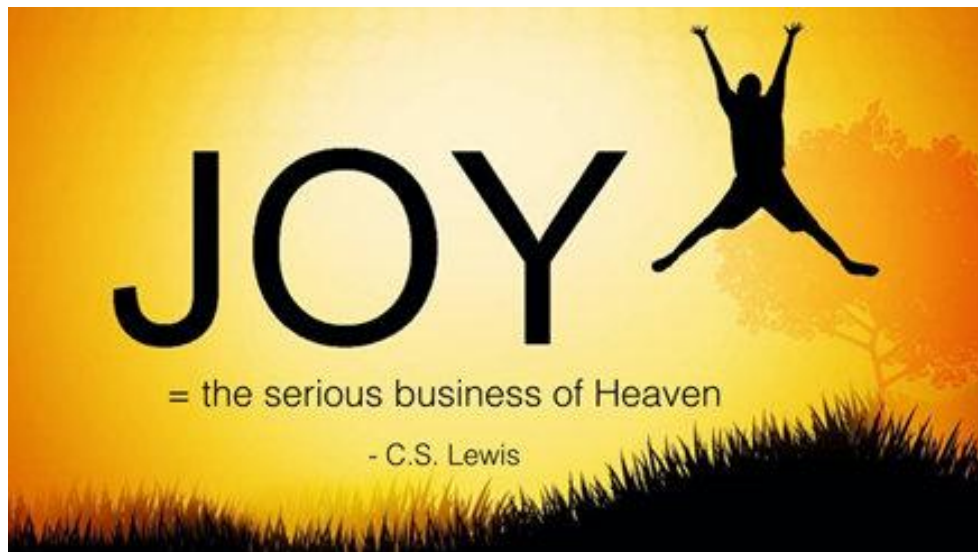

From The Associate Rector

As a detailed-oriented planner, I can easily get lost in the weeds, especially when there is a big project. One big project that 2020 will hold for our parish is creating and developing *Prayers from the Porch*. This past Spring, our Sacred Conversations group applied for a Diocese of Kentucky Mission Grant, for which we were awarded \$5,500 to develop a prayer book that engages the spiritual lives of those that we have come to be in relationship with who are currently unhoused, or those who are on the margins facing homelessness. This paired with an Outreach Grant from Christ Church of \$1,500, will give us room to work develop this project.

If you missed our forum in December where we talked about this project, we shared a bit about why we thought to apply for this grant to begin with. In particular, the Diocese's description about what might meet the grant's requirements caught our eye: "We need to spread the message about — and invite others to share — in God's grace and forgiveness. [The Diocese of Kentucky's] mission context is therefore the reality of the lives of people and communities in our area of Kentucky. What we do in mission and ministry must respond to the real human needs and concerns of the people in our communities." The Sacred Conversations group couldn't read that and not think of our Cloister Community.

We believe that in creating this prayer book resource, which will be given out in the relationships and conversations that started on the porch, but continue still will consider where we have been, where we are, and where we hope this ministry to go. We would like this project to not only engage the spiritual lives of our unsheltered neighbors and to radiate God's love to them, but also to shape and form the members of our congregation as we deepen our work and ministry with the poor and the oppressed. Not wanting to duplicate services offered in BG, we discerned that what is unique about who we are as Christ Church is tied to how we pray, and we firmly believe that prayer can change things.

Over this next year, we will be working to gather resources and will need contributions from the vast array of talents held within our congregation; we'll be looking for folks to write prayers, make drawings, capture stories, and help with editing and design. In your prayer for the coming year, I ask that you add discernment around this project and how you might be able to contribute to your prayers. We have a timeline laid out, with our goal of having a full and final draft by November 1, so work will begin soon!

Here is a working outline for the *Prayers from the Porch* prayer book:

- Written Prayers and Thanksgivings – Collect style prayers and thanksgivings.
- Body Prayers/Lord's Prayer – Prayer postures that engage the body.
- Coloring Pages – For those who need a thing to do as they pray.
- Way of Love (Photo Project) – A project of the EYC that will lean upon The Way of Love.
- Stories – Keeping anonymity, we hope to recount stories of hope from those who have been there.
- Prayer Types – Explorations into different types of prayer.
- Prayer and Guided Journal Prompts – Prompts for spontaneous and self-lead prayer.
- Blank Pages – For reflection, important information, or journaling.

We are very excited about this project and hope that you will join the Sacred Conversations group in its development throughout 2020. Feel free to contact me with any questions about this project, the timeline, or the ways in which you might be able to contribute at becca@cecbg.com.



Stewardship - From Ann Puckett

Stewardship is a topic that can be hard for some people to discuss but honestly the topic doesn't bother me. We have to talk about the importance of giving of our time, talents and financial resources as this parish wouldn't be the wonderful place it is today without many folks before us stepping up to build these incredible facilities; develop programming to help feed our souls and to make this such a welcoming place for all to enjoy.

Recently, my daughter, Shelby, and I had the honor of participating in the funeral held here for Sara Carmichael. As I had some quiet time sitting in the church before the service began, I reflected on this place and how special it has been in my life. I have had the good fortune of spending my entire life in this parish and as I reflected on this, I realized that my times of greatest joy as well as sorrow were spent in this sanctuary. My own baptism and confirmation, marriage, baptism and confirmation of my children as well as funerals for my grandparents and father. This parish has been there for me and my family every step of the way – in good times and in bad.

So, what does all of that have to do with stewardship? Have you ever heard the phrase “you get out of something what you put into it” or “80% of the work is done by 20% of the group”? Well I have always wanted to be part of the 20% because I have learned that you get so much more out of something if you put all your effort into it. If you immerse yourself in this parish and give generously of your time, talents AND your financial resources, you will receive back blessings tenfold. A few years ago, as we began to conduct capital campaign after capital campaign in addition to the annual giving to the operating fund, Troy and I decided to approach giving differently. We wouldn't give out of what was left over but rather we now reflect on the importance this place has in our lives and feel it is our responsibility to determine what our pledge should be and then decide what is left over to cover our discretionary or “fun” expenses. If we each thought long enough, we could find ways to “afford” pledging more. Anything is possible if we just set our minds to it.

So my ask is that you don't just take the pledge card you receive in the mail and pledge what you did last year. Stop, reflect on what this place means to you and how much more we could share the love of God in our community, and challenge yourself to “share the joy” and give more!

Vestry Nominations

The Vestry Nominating Committee is now accepting names to fill four three-year terms. To be eligible to serve, you must be a confirmed communicant in good standing of Christ Church for at least one year and willing to commit to faithful worship and working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God. Soft Worship Space

In keeping with our mission to “worship God with joy and wonder, Learn and grow together, and Radiate God's love to all,” Christ Church has adapted a “soft worship space” in Surface Hall where little ones can crawl around on soft carpet entertained by plush toys and books while parents tune into the service via TV monitor. While our church nursery, located in the front of the building, is still available for children under the age of 5, some children prefer to stay with their parents during worship, but are not able to withstand an entire service in the Nave.

Soft worship spaces, otherwise known as “praygrounds,” are trending around the world in an effort to encourage young children to become comfortable in church in hopes that when they grow up they will keep the weekly ritual. While some churches, from the US to Stockholm, are actually converting space *inside* the Nave, we will accommodate our littlest ones just outside. Please introduce yourself to our littlest members on your way in to worship!

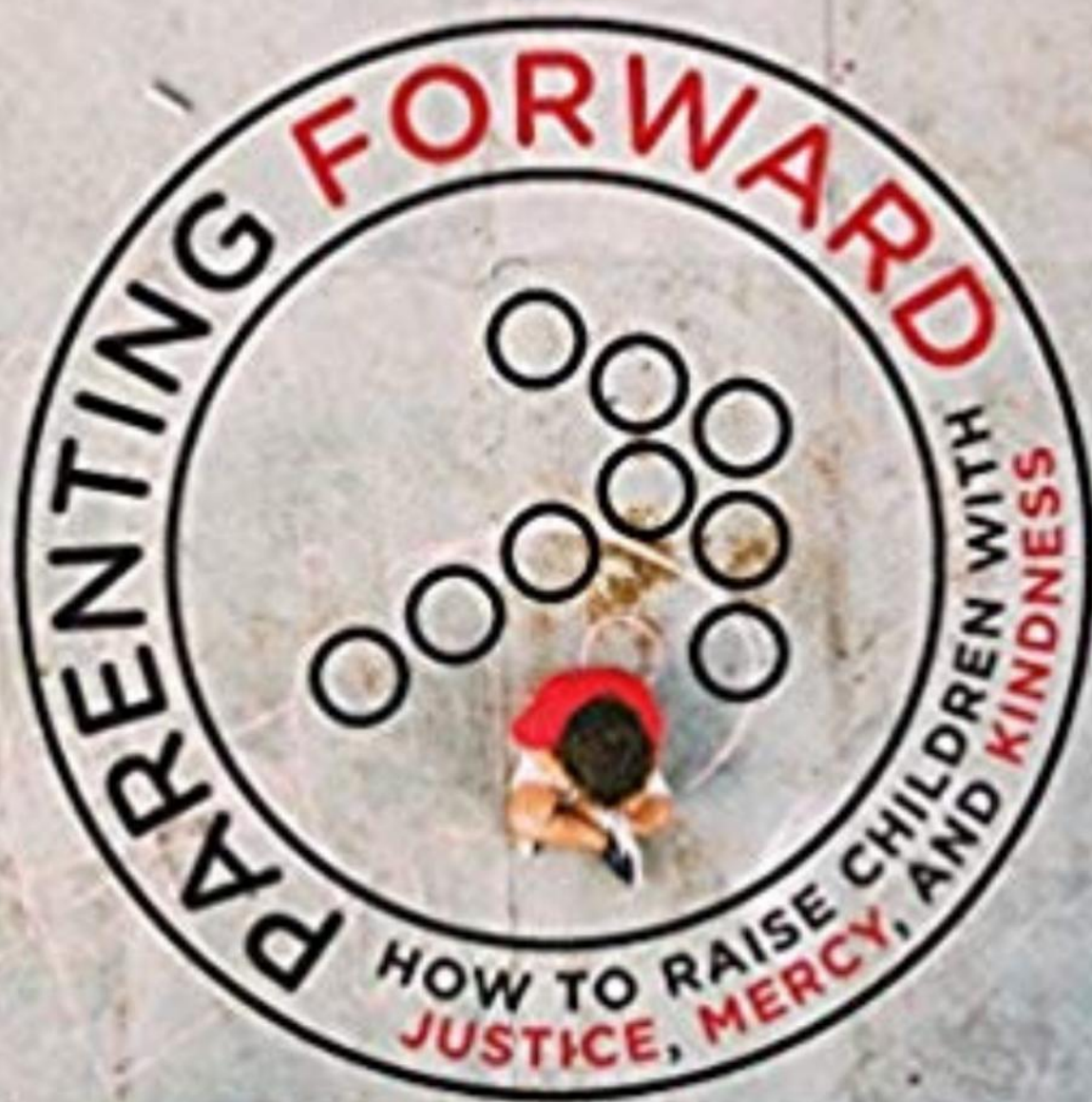

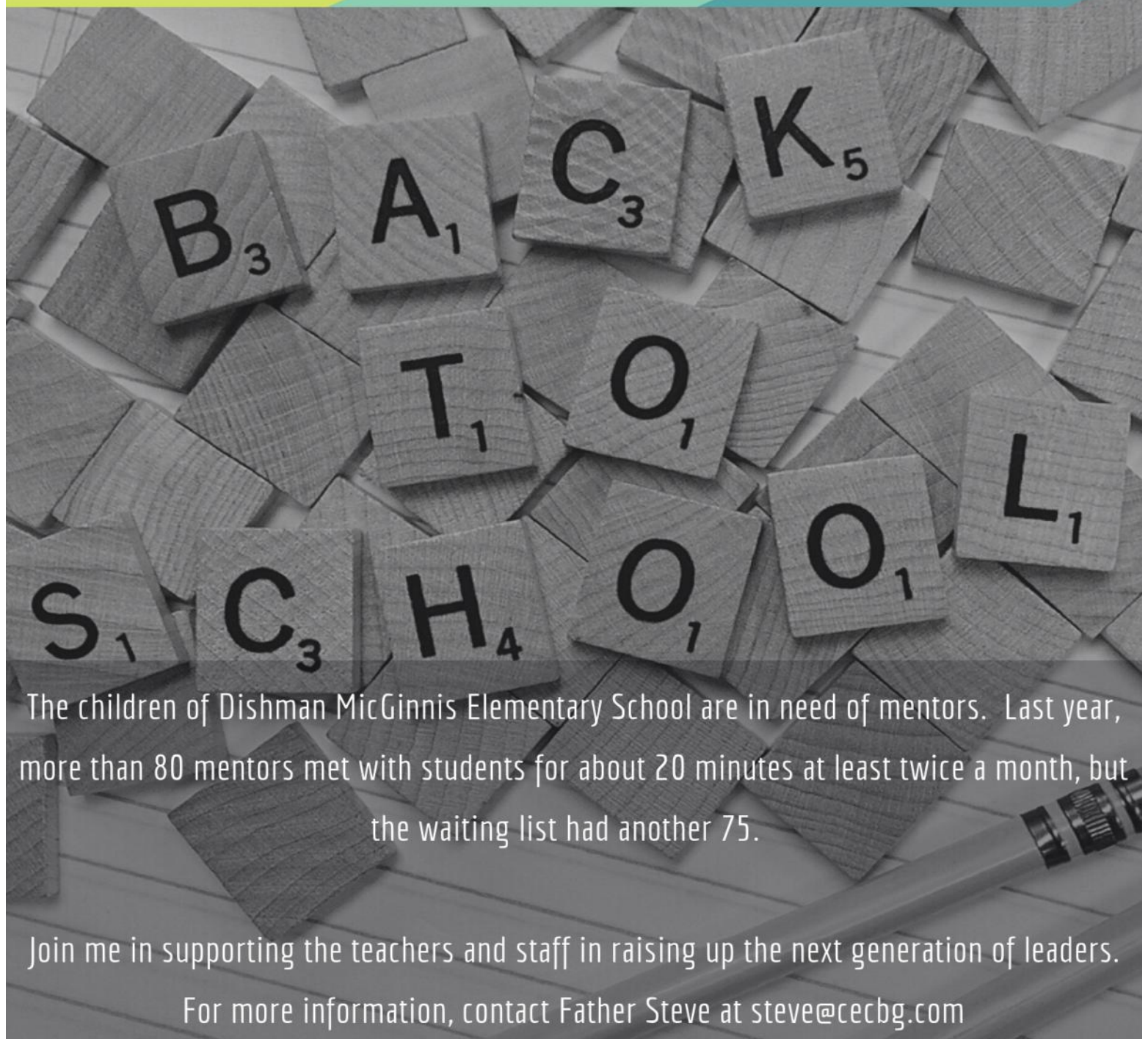

We are starting our 6th year in our new building and recently our school was recognized for being a "Lighthouse School" The relationships that you build with the students helps them to grow and learn each day!

The children of Dishman McGinnis need and want YOU!!! We are looking for people to commit to visiting a child at least twice monthly. This can be either reading with the child or eating lunch with them. That is basically up to the mentor. We are looking for you to spend approximately 20 minutes twice a month getting to know a child.

In partnership with the four other downtown Christian churches, we attempt to assist families with their electric bill, emergency prescriptions, gasoline for an out of town doctor appointment, etc. For the past several months, the NEED has far exceeded our resources to help. In order to effectively sustain this ministry we need for members to step up with a pledge of \$10 or more per week. The Help Ministry at Christ Church currently distributes about \$1,000 per month to those in need using a voucher system. We only help an individual once every 12 months. Help Ministry is a beautiful way to help your own community and share God's love to friends and neighbors in need.

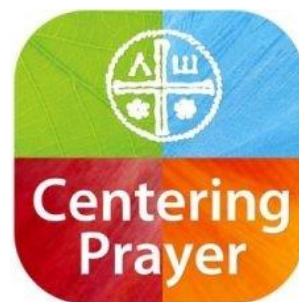

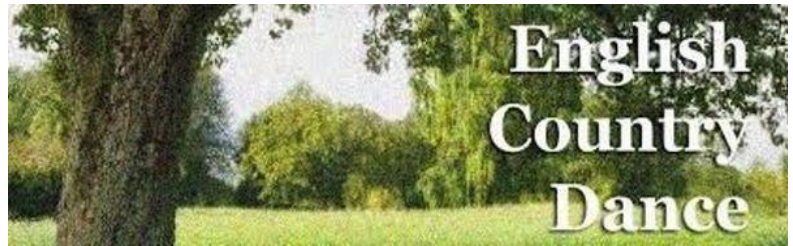

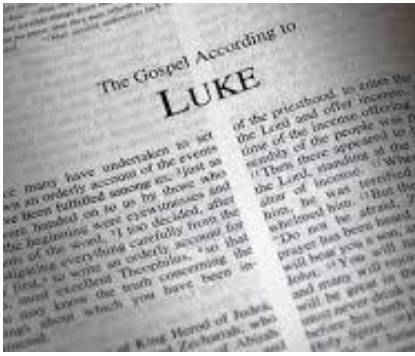
