

From The Rector

Dear Friends,

The sports radio podcast I listen to with regularity has teamed up with their sponsor, Dodge, to run the Dodge 25//8 contest. The premise of this contest is that athletes, like Dodge owners (I guess) know the importance of giving 110%. Working 24 hours a day, 7 days a week (24/7) isn't quite enough apparently, and so this contest invites listeners to exhibit the qualities of that 25/8 life. This is, of course, impossible. It is exhausting. It is life-stealing.



As the book of Exodus begins, a new Pharaoh had come to power in Egypt. He didn't not remember Joseph, the Hebrew who had become a beloved and trusted advisor of a previous king. As Pharaoh looked upon his kingdom, he saw the Israelites were great in number and had become quite strong from their years of hard work. He decided that the only way to keep them from rising up in revolt was to exhaust them, and so he set task masters over them, and forced them to harder and harder work and more and more hours. This went on for years and years, until one day, when the Hebrews groaned under their bondage, God heard their cry and sent Moses to begin the work of setting God's people free.

We were not created to work 24/7, let alone 25/8, but truth be told, the last 20 months have often felt like working both 0/0 and 29/12 all at the same time. Planning and changing plans. Praying and not having prayers answered. Working and not seeing results. Planning again only to change plans... again. It has been exhausting, and I know that I'm not alone. I know that many of you have felt the same stresses, the same uncertainly, the same sadness, pressure, and anxiety. Know that you are not alone.

Slow down. Quiet. It's Advent.

Turn off your notifications one evening. Take a sabbath. Find some rest. There will be just as much joy this Christmas, likely even more, if you do.

Know also that God hears your cries. For several years now, Forward Movement has published an Advent Calendar entitled "Slow down. Quiet. It's Advent." Amidst the hustle and bustle of a holiday season that has the specter of COVID-19 lingering even as we try to do things "normally," I hope you'll find some time this month to slow down; to

From The Associate Rector


Around this time nearly every year, I begin to ask how I can help our college students navigate through Advent. Having finished the crunch of final exams and getting to go home for the first time in months, and historically there is not a lot of interest or energy left in them. But so many of them are new to a liturgical tradition; so many have yet to experience the sacred and holy waiting in the dark that is the slow lead up to Advent. It's a hard thing to cultivate, even if you are a cradle Episcopalian. At the time of this writing, as I went to the store to pick up the last bit of Thanksgiving ingredients, Christmas music was blasting, and the brightness and seeming delight of the holiday season is abuzz. No wonder it's hard to get into the rhythm of Advent.

Last year, I got each of our students a copy of Scott Erickson's *Honest Advent: 25 Readings for Advent and Christmas*. The premise of this Advent meditation is to ground ourselves not in the darkness of Advent, nor in the preemptive brightness of Christmas come too soon, but to rather take an honest look at what the end of a 9 month miracle pregnancy in a world without stable housing. It's a beautifully artist and eloquent work that challenges us to see the new born Christ as fully human and fully divine. I commend this work to you if you are looking for an Advent meditation resource.

I expected to enjoy this book, but our students read it together, checking in weekly on Zoom, and I was surprised at how much the artwork spoke to them. Some of his simple line drawings with two tone colors leave a lot to the imagination, and other make stark his intent and focus. Perhaps one of my favorite chapters was "Unease" which begins, "There was a moment when the presence of God was felt as the unease of morning sickness. Don't be surprised if your current unease is that exact same avenue of presence." The art work paired with this reflection is of Mary, golden halo hovering over her head as she cradles her face in unease.

What I appreciate most about this work is the willingness of Erickson to reflect on the nitty gritty aspects of human life, to see them reflected back to us in Mary, the bearer of God, or in the newborn Christ. These are not lofty meditations that have no impact on how we live our daily lives, struggling to get by during a difficult season of life. Later in that same chapter, he says, "The process of growth is always uneasy, because growth never comes through ease. It comes through the stretching and expanding of one's own capacity to push on ahead."

Perhaps you, too, are in a season of unease and are longing for an honest Advent; if so, I recommend his book to you and will be glad to share with you in your reflections of it as we walk through this holy season. May whatever resources you use this time of our calendar be of profound grounding and enlightenment.




Christmas Flowers & Music Offering





Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, “Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.” And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, “Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!”

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, “Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.” So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.




