From The Rector

Dear Friends,



I am a sucker for a good buffet line. I'm careful not to frequent them so that I don't have to buy new clergy shirts every year, but I have found a particular weakness in the lunch buffet at India Oven on Scottsville Road. Buffets offer a real gift in that there are the old standards – butter chicken, for example – that I know I can go back to every time, but I also have the ability to try something new with very little risk. If I try it, and I like it, well then, my palate has expanded. If I try it, and realize it isn't for me, I've not really lost anything in the process.

I'm also a sucker for a good outreach ministry buffet. I think having various options, both within the auspices of Christ Church and out in the community with our partner organizations provides a great framework for as many people as possible to get involved. Whether it is delivering meals once a quarter, preparing lunch here weekly, volunteering at Manna Mart, donating to Churches United in Christ HELP Ministry, or any of the other available options, you can find a place, time, and community to serve, with very little risk, at least at the beginning. Of course, once you fall in love with an outreach ministry, the work – physical, mental, and spiritual – can become quite challenging.

As a result of the smorgasbord approach to outreach, long before my arrival here, outreach ministry was removed as a line item from the budget. As a result, these groups rely on direct donations from parishioners, to the tune of \$30,000 or more each year. In many ways, this piecemeal approach is just an extension of the buffet. If you find an area of ministry that speaks to you, whether you can volunteer or not, you can support it financially. This does, however, make any kind of bigger goals more difficult to achieve.

I'm happy to announce that creation of the Outreach Ministry Grant Program, funded, in part, by unspent Porter-Sims money from the past several years. Outreach ministries that are associated with Christ Episcopal Church will have the opportunity to request up to \$1,500 to tackle something bigger than usual so that they can expand the scope of their work. A brief application will be available on our website, and funds will be distributed at the discretion of the Vestry, as recommended by the Outreach Ministry Leadership Team. I'm grateful to the Vestry for their willingness to think outside the box on this and to help our many outreach ministries to expand their work in meaningful ways. From The Associate Rector

Dear Friends,

The gray lump of clay went round and round, the wobble that had become more pronounced with each rotation of the wheel as the clay danced below me; I held my hands out, hesitating on what do next. About half way through my first pottery class, I decided to fold the clay in on itself and try to begin anew. When you begin throwing pottery, I have learned, you have to make sure the clay is centered; as the wheel goes around, if they clay is centered, the piece will have the same shape all around. To center the clay, you throw it on the wheel and as the wheel begins to spin, you pull it up into a cone and then smoosh it back down into a hill. This process, when repeated, helps the clay become centered.



After that first class, I stayed back and practiced coning the clay for a while because I'm a tactile learner and my first piece was a wonky, wonderful disaster. As I coned the clay again and again, I learned that trying to push the clay into the center, forcing it to be where you want it doesn't really work. Instead, you have to have steady, strong hands that won't yield to the clay going off course, but instead, guide it to the center, simply by being unmoving. It's is not that the potter dominates the clay to where she wants it, but that she guides it by being a strong, present force as they clay makes its journey around the wheel.

It was at this point that I thought about a well-known imagery for how God relates to God's people came to mind:

The word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord: 'Come, go down to the potter's house, and there I will let you hear my words.' So I went down to the potter's house, and there he was working at his wheel. The vessel he was making of clay was spoiled in the potter's hand, and he reworked it into another vessel, as seemed good to him. Then the word of the Lord came to me: Can I not do with you, O house of Israel, just as this potter has done? says the Lord. Just like the clay in the potter's hand, so are you in my hand.'

I've always known this imagery for God and God's people; the idea that we are clay in God the potter's hand, but I had always assumed that meant that God could mold us and change us however God might please.

As I continued to cone the clay that day I thought about all the times in which God didn't force me to be or to become something I am not, but rather the times when I felt the gentle, yet unyielding, guidance. I've seen it in my prayers and in the long arc of my spiritual journey; I've seen it in simple things and in incredibly complex things. Looking back over my own life, I know that I am grateful for all the ways in which the potter has molded me into who I am today, and pray that I may continually be willing to be molded. My prayer for each of us individually and as a congregation of God's people is that we will be ever ready to be continually worked and reworked by the potter as we are molded into who we are meant to become.





We meet on the first and third Saturdays of each month in the Conference Room at 8:00am for fellowship and sharing a reflection on Sunday's Gospel reading.



Conversations with Scripture


