FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

Some of you might recall hearing about a city/county-wide initiative called City
Shapers. It began with a organizational meeting in February of 2020, and, well, you what has happened since. While COVID certainly hampered the work of the City Shapers cohort, it was made up of intrepid and hard-working people who care deeply about this community. For months we met via Zoom and then in socially distanced spaces with masks. We went out into the



community, met our neighbors, and listened to what they saw as needs right in their own neighborhoods.

When the tornadoes hit in December 2021, several of us had to step back from our City Shapers work to build the infrastructure of long-term recovery, but what we learned from the cohort informed us, even as that group also continued to meet even until now. Recently, I received a set of minutes form the most recent gathering of the City Shapers Cohort and was glad to see that two members of Christ Church, Shelley Carter and Kevin Brooks, continue to be a part of that conversation. Since their work is often behind the scenes and may have gotten lost in the aftermath of COVID and then the tornadoes, I'd like to share a little bit about what they are up to.

Early in the process, the focus of City Shapers homed in on the West End. A couple of the themes that came from our discussions with those neighbors were that they often feel disconnected, not just from the wider community, but from their own neighbors. Additionally, the population on the West End is often not as able to access information either due to limited internet connectivity or the lack of relationships. A new idea that has come forward is a walking group in the West End to engage with neighbors as well as to provide information about cost saving possibilities that might be unknown – things like prescription drug savings cards or phone plans for the elderly. The dual nature of this program – connecting and informing – reminds us of the core work of City Shapers.

City Shapers is also attempting to bring downtown churches back together. Two meetings have been held thus far: one at First Christian Church and one at First Baptist Church for congregational leaders to share their experiences in outreach ministry and to hear from local non-profits who are doing the work of outreach and community development on a daily basis. I've had the opportunity to attend both of those meeting, and I hope they continue, as we are so much stronger as a community when we work together.

City Shapers continues to be a real gift to Bowling Green and Warren County, and I am grateful for their work in building relationships, listening, learning, and working together to address the underlying causes of material poverty in our community.

FROM THE ASSOCIATE RECTOR

Dear Church,

In my annual report for 2023, I wrote about the things I've been joyful about in our common life and work at Christ Church and the things I'm holding in prayer. One of the things I've been holding in prayer is the reality that with the elimination of the Director of Youth and Communication staff position, all of your clergy and staff have had to take on new-to-them responsibilities. I'm holding this in prayer not just for those who take on those roles, but also for the life of the church. I know it's got to be a bit confusing about who to check in with about your Ministry Scheduler questions or who to send something you'd like to advertise in the parish. And when folks have come in to ask a question about this, we've realized that when Father Steve goes on Sabbatical next month, it'll all change for three months as well.

For questions around your Ministry Schedule for service minister roles, you can contact Vonda. she will run the quarter in late April for May, June, and July. You'll need to submit to her your exclusion dates when she contacts you so that we can have an up-to-date schedule. Vonda is also creating the slides that go over our livestream worship so that those worshipping from afar can follow along the service and she will also be making the bulletins when Steve is on Sabbatical.

Kate has taken on the bulk of the organizing responsibility for the Youth; if you would like to be trained to be a youth volunteer or to provide meals for EYC, please let her know.

When it comes to digital communications, we're taking a tiered approach. Vestry members Jamie Chaffin and David Kem will soon be organizing a social media team which will help with previously scheduled posts to keep our online presence active; if you are interested, please contact one of them. I've reworked the website and hope that you take time to go check it out. With the range of responsibilities I have, I plan to update the website about twice a year while monitoring the engagement and connections that come through that avenue regularly. And I am creating the Window monthly. If you would like something to be included in the Window, the deadline is the 22nd of the month before the Window comes out. For the April Window, however, the deadline will be March 20th, as the last week of the month (and last week before Steve's Sabbatical) is Holy Week and I will need to get the Window put together in the early part of the week.

My hope is that all of this has been and will continue to be as smooth a transition as possible, but no doubt things will and have fallen through the cracks. I know that you all are and will continue to be gracious, but also don't forget to remind me more than once if you see something that's missing! I appreciate reminders! Christ Church has a lot going on and it's a real joy!

On March 17, EYC is gathering here at CEC with other Downtown Churches' Youth to have a dinner and a game night.


If it works out this month, we'll have a volunteer block of time at the Humane Society on Saturday, March 23.



Over a period of three years, the National Order of the Daughters of the King (DOK) created a 2018-2021 Strategic Plan of The Order. This plan was created in response to and through the efforts of hundreds of Daughters and was designed to be a roadmap to guide the order's ministries, ensure continuity between National Councils, and build on the inspired foundation of the Order's past. This strategic plan is still being used. The plan presents a set of six prayerfully developed strategic goals. They are:

Goal #1 - Inspire Spiritual Growth and Development

Goal #2 - Strengthen Our Call to Service and Evangelism

Goal #3 - Nurture and Grow Our Members

Goal #4 - Raise Up and Mentor New Leaders

Goal #5 - Foster Community and Build Connections

Goal #6 - Instill a Spirituality of Giving

In January 2024, our chapter's DOK executive team discussed and prepared a draft 2024 Action Plan. 
