From The Rector

Dear Friends,

Christ Episcopal Church is a community of Christ's servants who seek to:

Worship God with joy and wonder;

Learn and grow together; and

Radiate God's love to all.

I've been saying these words since the summer of 2017, and was afraid they might be getting stale. Our Mission Statement isn't like most mission statements. It wasn't written so it could be used to check a box. It wasn't written to be filed away somewhere. It was written to be a living statement of who we believe God is calling us to be. So it is that our Mission Statement sustained our staff during the hard days of COVID. When we didn't know what to do, we looked at that statement and answered the call to find ways for our community to worship, learn, grow, and radiate God's love to all.

Still, six years is a long time for a mission statement and so I invited your Vestry to gather for an afternoon of reflection. During our four hour meeting, the Vestry and Clergy of Christ Church took intentional time to dig into what it means to live into our calling. We listened to stories of how our worship brings us joy and invites us into wonder. We pondered all the ways we have been able to learn and grow. We looked at the myriad of different ways God's love is radiated to our members and our community. And, we took some time to do some honest discernment about the ways we are falling short. I can't tell you how appreciative I am of the Vestry at Christ Church, not just in its current incarnation, but every Vestry I've worked



with since I arrived here has been gifted in its own ways.

In the end, we decided that now is not the time to change our Mission Statement, but rather to take it even more seriously, to set some goals based on our desire to worship with joy and wonders, to learn and grow together, and to radiate God's love to all. It'll take a few months to flesh those goals out, but it feels like we are off to a good start in engaging more deeply what God is invited Christ Church to do and to be.

From The Associate Rector

My favorite artifact in the church hasn't changed in my almost six years here. Since day one, my favorite piece of church history is the flyer hanging just around the corner from the coffee machines in what's known as the "Coke Hallway" by the bathrooms. It's a flyer for a 1923 Street Fair held to raise funds for the Parish House. Admission was 10 cents, and the flyer boasts of music, dancing in the street, fortune telling, palm reading, and other sundry games. Part of why I love this piece of Christ Church history so much is that I'm able to see the levity with which our ancestorial heritage held when it came to things that were quite scandalous. The joy of being together seems to be a thread that weaves all throughout Christ Church's history, and this summer, 100 years later, we're going to throw another Street Fair!



About a year ago, I walked into Steve's office and said something to the effect of, "What if we threw a street fair 100 years later?" He readily agreed, and since then it's been on our collective to-do lists, both of us unsure of if or how it would happen. But as we neared the summer, we learned of the city's efforts to bring back Duncan Hines Days, a week-long festival celebrating Bowling Green, to the city, and we jumped on the bandwagon. So as part of the festival in in June, we are hosting a Street Fair free to the community on Tuesday, June 6th from 5pm-8pm. David Lee has gathered snippets in papers advertising the Street Fair from 1923, which has been fun to see.

There will be obvious differences between the two events, but we are looking forward to this event and offering it to the community. What first drew me to the original flyer was the sense of joy and delight that the people of our congregation had 100 years ago as they raised funds to build the Parish House, which held classrooms for Sunday School. There will be bounce houses, games, bands, and, of course, dancing in the street. In a lot of ways, I see this event as an opportunity to reach out to our neighbors, to provide some free fun for the community and to celebrate the joy we share when we gather together!

Real Street Dance Main Feature At Street Fair The main feature of the street fair to be given Friday, June 15 on State street, just above the intersection of Twelfth street, by the St. Margaret's Guild of Christ Episcopal church for the benefit of a parish house, will be dancing in the street, which will be pre-pared for the purpose. Street dancing gained popularity during the World War and was often the chief amusement in the towns where soldier trains were stopping. There will be two orchestras to furnish music for the dancers. A cabaret and rose bower num ber will be given by Mr. S. Arthur, a talented musician of New York City, assisted by a number of Bowling Green's sub-debutnates.


VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!


A Prayer for Memorial Day




We will then take a week (or two) to revisit The Great Emergence by reading some articles about paradigm shifts in the Christian Church in America.




