## FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

Last month, I wrote to you about the importance of discernment in community and how it will take all of us to find ways to fill the significant hole left by Mother Becca's departure for the Canon Missioner position in the Diocese of Lexington. I am very grateful to the full-time staff: Vonda, Kate, and Ken; Deacon Kellie, Lisa our new Communications Director, the ECM Peer Ministers Maddie and Taryn, as well as the many volunteers who have helped keep things running smoothly in our first 6 weeks or so of the transition.

Now that we have our feet under us, it is time to turn our attention to what comes next. As I've said previously, anytime a staff change occurs, it is a good opportunity to look at the bigger picture of our wants and needs and to evaluate if we are being the best stewards of the resources entrusted to our care. Now is the time to begin that process in earnest. In early January, the Vestry and I agreed to a discernment timeline.

- January 12 end of February we catch our breath, allow space for feelings around Becca's departure to be felt, and see what holes we didn't plan for arise.
- March Launch a discernment committee that will be tasked with looking at the mission of Christ Church and its big picture needs at the clergy, lay staff, and volunteer levels.
- April listening sessions with vestry, staff, members, and diocesan leadership to listen to the needs and wants, hopes and dreams of the community.
- Early May a retreat in which the committee reports back to the Vestry on their understanding of our common mission and recommendations on the staffing (clergy, lay, and volunteer) needs to live into our calling.

Here's where you come in. This discernment committee won't populate itself. I'm looking for five to eight people who would be willing to commit to three months of hard work as we look at our shared mission and how can best fulfill that calling given the realities we face in 2025 and beyond. This group will organize listening sessions to garner feedback and to evaluate how are are or aren't living into our mission statement. Then, together with the Vestry, they will seek ways to align our budget and staff with our mission priorities.

If you'd like to serve, please let me know. If you'd like to nominate someone let me know. If you have questions, let me know. This is an important time in our common life, and I'm certain that God has provided us with the gifts and talents necessary to discern our next steps. And, if you don't feel called to serve on the committee, that's ok. I do hope you'll participate in a listening session so that we can hear from the widest possible cross-section of our community.

Thank you again for your prayers in this season of transition. Please, keep it up.

### FROM THE DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

As we approach Lent, we have a great activity planned for our Children and Youth for Eastertide lasting from March 5-June 8 with some fun giveaways and displays!

#### **Children: Eastertide Reading Celebration**

Children in PreK-5th grade will be issued official "CEC Children's Library Cards." Each child gets a punch card with books in 5 book increments up to 100 books, and a reading log. They can use any books we read in Children's Church, too. Children can use Children's Church time, or Sunday School Response time to check out up to 5 books at a time every week. They can only check out CEC books, though. We have over 300 books in our library for them and are always ordering new ones. For every 10 books read, children can pick a prize. Every book your child reads gets them a raffle ticket for a basket drawing on Pentecost Sunday. We'll pick three tickets and the winner gets to pick one of three baskets. Parents and children can download the Libib app from Apple or Google Play and search for books. You can also go to https://www.libib.com/u/cecbglibrary to check out our great selection. All the details can be found under our "Events" tab at cecbg.com, and we'll have pictures of the baskets once they are ordered, and extra reading logs.

#### YOUTH EASTERTIDE CELEBRATION

Youth in grades 6-12 also have a contest during Eastertide. Starting March 5, youth can create a display using Legos, Peeps, poster(s), mixed media, or photographs around one of the following themes: The Life of Jesus; The Miracles of Jesus; The Story of Holy Week (The Stations of the Cross); The Easter Sundays: (Disappearance from the Tomb to Pentecost). All of these themes have correlated Godly Play stories. Youth who participate in this celebration will receive a raffle ticket for every day their project is on display-ex. Bring in your display by March 5 or March 9, get a ticket for every day of the week from March 5 to June 8. On Pentecost Sunday, we'll do a drawing for three \$50 Visa gift cards for the youth. CEC has a limited supply of Legos, but we'll be happy to supply Peeps, develop photos, provide poster boards, or art supplies for the youth to use. If youth would like to use different media, please let Ms. Kate know so we can get them supplies. Youth can also create a dance, video, Instagram display, or whatever they would like to try. If it is digital media, we can provide links to the videos on the CEC website, so everyone can see it.




### March 25th

Bread of Angels is a small group exploring what it means to live a Christian Life in the world in which we find ourselves. BoA describes itself as a book club with a theological bend – a format that supports dialogue as each of us wrestles with our authors and with God.

In March, we will continue reading Richard Rohr's *Falling Upward*. Fr Richard Rohr (b 1943) is a Franciscan Priest globally recognized as an ecumenical teacher and theologian. He is the founder of the Center for Action and Contemplation in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Fr. Richard's teaching is grounded in the Franciscan alternative orthodoxy--practices of contemplation and self-emptying, expressing itself in radical compassion, particularly for the socially marginalized. Rohr is famous for saying "We do not think ourselves into new ways of living, we live ourselves into new ways of thinking."


