#### FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

I'll never ask you to do something that I'm not willing to do. So, when I recently asked you to consider pledging donations of time, talent, and treasure, I did so knowing that I also had to make such a pledge. I give financially to the mission and ministry of Christ Church. I share my gifts, having fixed a toilet or two around here. But since I get paid to be here, giving of my time is a little harder. A commitment I made long ago was to give my time as a volunteer to an organization that is outside the Church. Over the years, I've served on several boards of directors, often for non-profits focused on early childhood education.



Recently, I was invited to serve on the Kentucky ALICE Research Advisory Committee. Two meetings and a document to read were the only requirements, which I thought I could do, though I have to admit, I had no idea what ALICE meant.

ALICE stands for Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed, and it tries to capture those who sit in the gap between the Federal Poverty Level and an actual sustainable lifestyle. The ALICE budget is based on realistic figures, on a county by county basis, for things like housing, childcare, food, transportation, health care, technology, and taxes. While the study is not yet complete, what I've

already seen is eye opening. In Kentucky 17% of households are considered to be in poverty based on the Federal Poverty Level of \$15,650 for a single person, and \$32,100 for a family of four. Those living below the ALICE Survival Budget make up another 28%! That means some 44% of Kentucky households don't make what they need to get by, even with full-time work!

Meeting ALICE was eye opening. Down here at 1215 State Street, we see many people who live in material poverty every day. Some of them are experiencing homelessness. Some are barely scraping by living in the Towers on the minimum that Social Security has to offer. Many of these folks are elderly, having worked their whole lives, having never been able to catch up. The reasons are myriad, but chief among them is an economic system that squeezes as much out of its labor force as it can in order to maximize stock values and returns on investment. I'm not saying capitalism is bad – heck, I studied business administration in undergrad – but I am keenly aware of how the capitalist system is used to exploit the working class.

I don't have answers for ALICE's situation, but having met her, I thought I'd tell you about her. I pray for our neighbors who are working yet not earning enough. Who are retired or disabled, but not able to hold it all together. Who are falling short of the essentials needed to thrive. I hope you will pray for ALICE too.

While our planned trip to Mammoth Cave National Park had to be postponed due to the government shutdown, we look forward to rescheduling soon!





#### **BREAD OF ANGELS**



Open to everyone with a bit of curiosity about being Christian

Bread of Angels is a small group exploring what it means to live a Christian Life in theworld in which we find ourselves. BoA describes itself as a book club with a theological bend – a format that supports dialogue as we wrestle with our authors and with God.

This month we are reading Inspired by Rachel Held Evans. Evans was an American Christian columnist, blogger and author, publishing two children's books and five best selling books for grown ups. Tragically, she died on May 4, 2019, from extensive swelling in her brain that was a complication of a severe allergic reaction to antibiotics she was prescribed for a flu and urinary tract infection. Her impact on Christianity today has been enormous.

Emma Green, writing for The Atlantic, notes that Evans "was part of a vanguard of progressive-Christian women who fought to change the way Christianity is taught and perceived in the United States."



About this book: "If the Bible isn't a science book or an instruction manual, what is it? What do people mean when they say the Bible is inspired? When New York Times bestselling author Rachel Held Evans found herself asking these questions, she embarked on a journey to better understand what the Bible is and how it's meant to be read. What she discovered changed her--and it can change you, too."






