FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

I have long been a believer in the power of prayer. I suppose one doesn't make it as an ordained person very long if they don't. Still, it can be hard, at times, to remember just how powerful prayer can be. Life can feel overwhelming: what with illness, financial stress, relationship trouble, and *gestures broadly* any number of other difficulties that life can bring. Occasionally, however, God gives you the opportunity to see prayer in action.



On a sweltering Wednesday evening, about 100 people gathered at the Terenga Academy to welcome home Ernesto Manuel-Andres. As I'm sure you've heard by now, Ernesto was wrongfully detained by Immigration and Customs Enforcement officers on June 4, and was eventually taken to a detention facility in Monroe, LA. News of his arrest trickled out over June 9 and 10, and by Father's Day, it seemed the whole Bowling Green community had adopted Ernesto as one of their own.

So it is that on June 17, 19, and 23 prayer vigils were held at three local churches, including ours, to pray for Ernesto's safety and his release. We prayed and sang and even fasted for a day, much to the chagrin of a few local pastors, in the hope that God would hear our prayer and move the mountains of bureaucratic red tape and official and unofficial immigration policies to secure his release and return to his Bowling Green home.

On June 23, Ernesto had a hearing before an immigration judge on the one charge that, though unsubstantiated, had been filed. She granted him the lowest bond allowed by law, \$1,500, and things looked promising, until a few moments later when the Department of Homeland Security withheld their right to appeal. Heartbroken as we were, our prayers did not stop. Praying for justice is never wasted. Late on June 24, news broke that DHS had failed to meet their first deadline in the appeal process and Ernesto could be released on bond. Even more, one DHS staffer stayed late to make sure his bond was correctly processed, and he was released as soon as possible.

Prayer works. It can change hearts and minds, and even unjust systems, and I am grateful for the reminder.

We all have things in our lives that could use some prayer. May Ernesto's story remind us of three things: 1) prayer works, 2) prayer is a communal activity, and 3) persistence pays off.




The Brotherhood of Saint Andrew invites all men and male youth of Christ Church to join us in service to the church and to the community.


Open to everyone with a bit of curiosity about being Christian

This month we start what is becoming a summer tradition and explore another faith practice. Last summer we read about Islam. This year we have picked Buddhism.


Buddhism is primarily an Asia-Pacific faith practice and is followed by about 7% of the Earth's population, making it the worlds fourth largest religious religion. Buddhism is recognized by most faiths as a religion, but it is non-theistic which makes it much different from the Abrahamic Religions.



Our author is Damien Keown, Professor Emeritus of Goldsmiths, University of London. His DPhil is from Oriental Studies, Oxford University. He is regarded as perhaps the leading expert on Buddhism is the Western World, much in the way that Professor John Esposito is regarded when discussing Islam. And at 74 he is a perfect age for BoA.

The book we will read is *Buddhism, A Very Short Introduction*, part of a growing library of Oxford University "Very Short Introductions" created to give people like us an accessible but sophisticated look into very specific topics.


